- 1.As used in this contract "ticket" means this passenger ticket and baggage check, or this itinerary/receipt if applicable, in the case of an electronic ticket, of which thes e conditions and the notices form part, "carriage" is equivalent to "transportation", "c arrier" means all air carriers that carry or undertake to carry the passenger or his ba gagage hereunder or perform any other service incidental to such air carriage, "electronic ticket" means the itinerary/receipt issued by or on behalf of Carrier, the Electronic Coupons and, if applicable, a boarding document. "Warsaw Convention" means the Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules Relating to International Carriage by Air signed at Warsaw, 12th October 1929 or that Convention as amended at The Hague, 28th September 1955, whichever may be applicable. "Montreal Convention" means the Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules for International Carriage by Air signed at Montreal, 28 May 1999.
- 2. Carriage hereunder is subject to the rules and limitations relating to liability establ ished by the Warsaw Convention or the Montreal Convention unless such carriage is not "International carriage" as defined by that Convention.
- 3. - 8. This ticket is good for carriage for one year from date of issue, except as otherwise provided in this ticket, in carrier's tariffs, conditions of carriage, or related regulations. The fare for carriage hereunder is subject to change prior to commencement of carriage. Carrier may refuse transportation if the applicable fare has not been paid.
- 9. Times shown in timetables or elsewhere are not guaranteed and form no part of t his contract. Carrier may without notice substitute alternate carriers or aircraft, and may alter or omit stopping places shown on the ticket in case of necessity. Schedul es are subject to change without notice. Carrier assumes no responsibility for makin g connections.
- 10. Passenger shall comply with Government travel requirements, present exit, entry and other required documents and arrive at airport by time fixed by carrier or, if no time is fixed, early enough to complete departure procedures.
- 11. No agent, servant or representative of carrier has authority to alter, modify or wa ive any provision of this contract.

- ADVICE TO INTERNATIONAL PASSENGERS ON LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Passengers on a journey involving an ultimate destination or a stop in a country oth er than the country of departure are advised that international treaties known as the Montreal Convention, or its predecessor, the Warsaw Convention, including its ame ndments (The Warsaw Convention system), may apply to the entire journey, including any portion thereof within a country. For such passengers, the applicable treaty, including special contracts of carriage embodied in any applicable tariffs, governs and may limit the liability of the carrier.

- NOTICE OF BAGGAGE LIABILITY LIMITATIONS

Liability for loss, delay, or damage to baggage is limited unless a higher value is de clared in advance and additional charges are paid. In the case of carriage subject to the Montreal Convention, as to any claim arising under Article 1 7 of the Convention which does not exceed 128,821 SDRs, the carrier shall not be able to exclude or limit its liability. Above the 128,821 SDRs, the carrier shall not be liable if the carrier proves (1) it was not due to the negligence or other wrongful act or omission of the carrier, or (2) it was solely due to the negligence or other wrongful act or omission of a third party.

- DENIDED BOARDING, CANCELLATION AND DELAY IN EU

In case of a denied boarding, flight cancellation or flight delay departing from EU m ember state, we offer assistance and compensation to the concerned passengers a ccording to the Regulation EC 261/2004.

- DENIED BOARDING BY OVERBOOKING

In order to minimize the effect of "no shows" and to permit seats to be used by pass engers who otherwise would not be able to travel on a chosen flight, carriers may o verbook flights.
