1.As used in this contract "ticket" means this passenger ticket and baggage check, or this itinerary/receipt if applicable, in the case of an electronic ticket, of which thes e conditions and the notices form part, "carriage" is equivalent to "transportation", "carrier" means all air carriers that carry or undertake to carry the passenger or his ba grage hereunder or perform any other service incidental to such air carriage, "electronic ticket" means the itinerary/receipt issued by or on behalf of Carrier, the Electronic Coupons and, if applicable, a boarding document. "Warsaw Convention" means the Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules Relating to International Carriage by Air signed at Warsaw, 12th October 1929 or that Convention as amended at The Hague, 28th September 1955, whichever may be applicable. "Montreal Convention" means the Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules for International Carriage by Air signed at Montreal, 28 May 1999.

2. Carriage hereunder is subject to the rules and limitations relating to liability establ ished by the Warsaw Convention or the Montreal Convention unless such carriage is not "International carriage" as defined by that Convention.

3. To the extent not in conflict with the foregoing carriage and other services performed by each carrier are subject to: (1) provisions contained in the ticket; (2) applica ble tariffs; (3) carrier's conditions of carriage and related regulations which are mad e part hereof (and are available on application at the offices of carrier), except in transportation between a place in the United States or Canada and any place outside thereof to which tariffs in force in those countries apply.

4. 11. No agent, servant or representative of carrier has authority to alter, modify or wa ive any provision of this contract.

The liability of AAR is limited to 1,288 SDRs for checked and unchecked baggage where the Montreal Convention applies to your jour ney. Above the 128,821 SDRs, the carrier shall not be liable if the carrier proves (1) it was not due to the negligence or other wrongful act or omission of the carrier, or (2) it was solely due to the negligence or other wrongful act or omission of a third party.

#### - DENIDED BOARDING, CANCELLATION AND DELAY IN EU

In case of a denied boarding, flight cancellation or flight delay departing from EU m ember state, we offer assistance and compensation to the concerned passengers a ccording to the Regulation EC 261/2004.

In order to minimize the effect of "no shows" and to permit seats to be used by pass engers who otherwise would not be able to travel on a chosen flight, carriers may o verbook flights.
